Information on "Deferred Action for Parents" and "Expanded Deferred Action"

There are many issues to be ironed out before the new and expanded Deferred Action programs, announced by President Obama on November 20, 2014, can begin.

The message at this time is:

STOP! WAIT!

There currently is **NO** registration process. The Immigration Office has received **90 days** to design the expanded "Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals" process and **180 days** to design the "Deferred Action for Parents" process.

Attorneys at the Immigrant Legal Center of Boulder County are studying the process, and will offer legal assistance once the government announces all of the details.

The Immigrant Legal Center will host a community forum in January to discuss the latest information.

Date and Location To Be Determined, So Check Back Often!

During this waiting period, candidates might consider gathering:

- *Birth certificate and English translation
- *Passport from home country
- *FBI fingerprint check (if uncertain about prior incidents)
- *Proof of residence in the U.S. Prior to January 1, 2010
- *Proof of continuous residence in the U.S. for the past 5 years

(School records, bank records, medical records and even speeding tickets can help prove residence.)

- *List of addresses and places of employment since entering the United States
